



November 8th General Election Results

The November election is in the books and Michigan voters cast approximately 4.5 million ballots. While Hillary Clinton has conceded the presidential election to Donald Trump, Michigan's final tally is not complete. Currently, Donald Trump has a .5% lead in the state. Michigan's Congressional delegation was a clean sweep for incumbents with the open seats going to Republicans Jack Bergman in the 1st District and Paul Mitchell in the 10th District for a 9-5 Republican favored split.

In the State House, Republicans have won every contested seat, with one exception, for a 63-47 majority as well as defeating incumbent democrat Bill LaVoy. It appears Democrat Darrin Camillari will defeat Republican Bob Howey in the 23rd District. Some of the toss up elections for incumbent Republicans include the 62nd where John Bizon won, the 71st being maintained by Tom Barrett as well as the 91st with Holly Hughes maintaining her seat.

The two State Board of Education slots are too close to call with slight leads going to Republicans Tom McMillin and Nikki Snyder. The University of Michigan Board of Regents, while not quite finalized, looks likely to retain Democrat Denise Ilitch and add Republican Ron Weiser. Democrat Dianne Byrum and Republican Dan Kelly are in the lead currently for the Michigan State University Board of Trustees. Wayne's States Board of Governors has two open seats that are too close to call with less than half a point separating the four top candidates.

For the Michigan Supreme Court, Justices David Viviano and Joan Larson retained their respective seats on the bench.

Yesterday's election also included a special Michigan Senate election to fill a seat vacated with the resignation of former Senator Virgil Smith. Ian Conyers, great nephew of Congressman John Conyers, will fill the seat and will likely be sworn in quickly restoring the chamber to a 27-11 Republican majority.
